#### The Fabelmans (2nd showing)

Growing up in post-World War II era Arizona, a young man named Sammy Fabelman discovers a shattering family secret and explores how the power of films can help him see the truth. Directed by Steven Spielberg, this semi-autobiography is based on his own childhood growing up in post-war Arizona, from age seven to eighteen.

# Bird Banding: A Research Tool for Understanding Bird Migration with Bryan Joyce

Established in 1995, the Prince Edward Point Bird Observatory is one of the most successful migration monitoring stations in Canada. Brian Joyce will take us behind the scenes of this research station situated on a National Wildlife Area near Lake Ontario. Brian will explain how birds are captured, recorded and safely released. Learn how this globally significant birding area attracts an abundance of song birds, butterflies and Saw-whet owls every year.

Brian is the Co-founder of the Prince Edward Point Bird Observatory who received his ecology degree from Carleton University.


