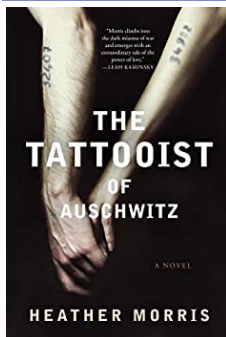

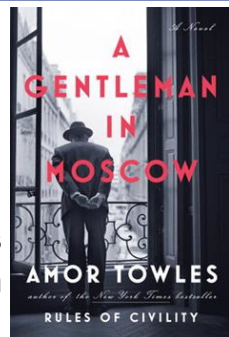

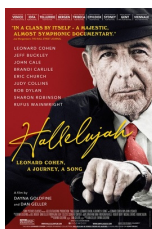

Hallelujah: Leonard Cohen, A Journey, A Song

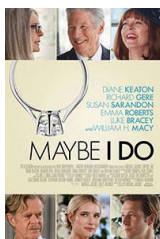
Thursday, April 20th at 6:30 pm (105 min)
