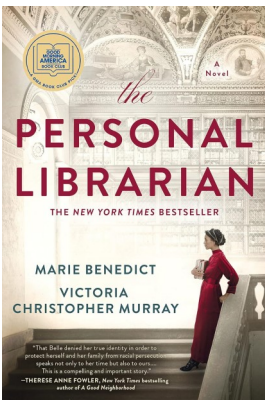
### **Ali & Ava (1hr 35min)**

## Makerspace Classes

Do you have project ideas for the new Makerspace equipment but feel like you need an introduction to get you started? These classes are free and have very limited registration. The projects will be pre-selected by staff and any materials needed will be supplied at no cost. Please register at the information desk or by calling 905-985-7686 ex. 101. Sign up for one of the following small group (2 to 4 people) classes to get an overview of the basics:

**Intro to Glowforge:** this 90 minute class will introduce you to our laser cutter/engraver – ideal for use with wood, leather, acrylic and card stock.

You will explore the Glowforge app and learn how to select and modify a basic project to send to the Glowforge. Adults & Teens ages 14+. Maximum of 4 participants per class.

**When: Tuesday, January 9th at 1:30 to 3 pm or Thursday, January 25th from 1:30 to 3 pm**

**Intro to Cricut:** this 90 minute class will introduce you to our craft cutter – ideal for cutting paper, card stock, and vinyl or drawing with infusible ink. You will explore the Cricut Design app and learn how to select and create a basic project to send to the Cricut. Adults & Teens ages 14+. Maximum of 4 participants per class.

**When: Monday, January 15th from 2 to 3:30 pm or 4 to 5:30 pm**

**Intro to 3D Printing:** this 90 minute class will introduce you to our Prusa 3D printer. You will explore the Printables website to select a basic project and learn how to import it into the Prusa Slicer app. Once in the Slicer, you will learn more about which settings to modify to ensure a successful print and how to transfer your project to the 3D printer. Adults & Teens ages 14+. Maximum of 4 participants per class.

**When: Monday, January 22nd from 2 to 3:30 pm or 4 to 5:30 pm**

**Sewing Machine Basics:** Have you always wanted to learn how to sew? Sign-up for one of our 90-minute introductory sessions to learn how to: wind a bobbin, thread a machine, sew in a straight line using a variety of stitching techniques, make a proper seam, and sew a pin-cushion that you can take home. Adults & Teens ages 14+. Please register for one of the 6 sessions offered. Maximum of 2 participants per class.
