
The Holdovers (2 hr 13min)


Nobody likes teacher Paul Hunham, not his students, not his fellow faculty, not the headmaster, who all find his pomposity and rigidity exasperating. With no family and nowhere to go over Christmas holiday in 1970, Paul remains at school to supervise students unable to journey home. After a few days, only one student hold-over remains, a trouble-making 15-year-old named Angus, a good student whose bad behavior always threatens to get him expelled. Joining Paul and Angus is head cook Mary, an African American woman who caters to sons of privilege and whose own son was recently lost in Vietnam. These three very different ship-wrecked people form an unlikely Christmas family sharing comic misadventures during two very snowy weeks in New England.

Next Goal Wins (1hr 44min)



North Durham Nature: A Field Guide to the Trees of Ontario

A Field Guide To Trees of Ontario, published in April 2023 is the latest book in the Royal Ontario Museum's popular field guide series. Deborah Metsger, ROM's Assistant Curator of Plants, and coauthor of this publication will provide a guided tour through its 508 pages. She will provide insights into the process of building a field guide, and share some of the features, anecdotes and spectacular pictures of the naturally occurring and cultivated species that comprise Ontario's diverse tree flora.

Her publications include Managing the Modern Herbarium (co-editor, 1999), The ROM Field Guide to Wildflowers of Ontario (co-author, 2004), Trees, Shrubs and Vines of Toronto (coordinating author, 2016), part of the City of Toronto Biodiversity Series, and Field Guide to Trees of Ontario (co-author, 2023).
