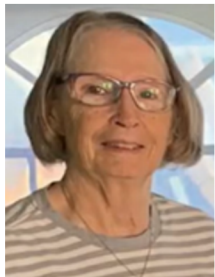

Thursday, June 11th at 6:00pm (please note earlier start time)

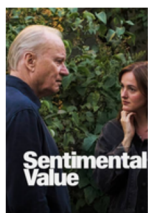
